Clinical Application

Assessment: Consider volunteer goals

Therapy:

- Help PwA navigate websites, make introductions, plan, schedule, etc.
- Example targets for volunteer visits:
 - Script training: Meaningful phrases for site.
 - Response Elaboration Training: Use photos from volunteer work to elicit responses.
 - AAC: Set up functional vocabulary for site.
 - Supported Communication: Bring communication packet, whiteboard, etc.







Outcomes

Initial pre/post survey data reveals improvements across all areas.
