

Aphasia Awareness Day: An Inter-Professional & Community Education Tradition



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Aphasia Awareness Day (7th Annual)

Monday in June 2024 1:30-4:30 pm, event space in the University Speech-Language-Hearing Clinic building

80 attendees: Students and faculty from Physician Associate, Nursing, Physical Therapy programs, university police, open to the general public

1:30-2:45 | Intro to SCA[™] eLearning (Kagan et al., 2025) large group training + pre & post survey



2:55-3:55 | Attendees divided into 3 groups and rotated through stations, 20 minutes each: 1) 2 people with aphasia told healthcare students what they'd like healthcare providers to know and answered questions, 2) Stroke Education, 3) The SLP's role in working with stroke survivors

4:00-4:30 | Panel Discussion: 4 people with aphasia & 3 care partners answered questions from the moderator and audience

Small group led by 2 people with aphasia (3 20-min. sessions)

Large panel discussion with 4 people with aphasia (30 minutes)

Intro to SCA[™] eLearning group training

Met with Aphasia Institute to get **special permission** to present the eLearning (Kagan et al., 2025) to a large audience.

Consent forms, Measured learning with pretest, posttest, N = 69, AASK survey (Power et al., 2020, 2021)

Corri Newman thesis finding, sig increases: knowledge of aphasia, recall of SCA strategies, confidence in being able to communicate with people with aphasia.

Conclusion: positive impact of SCA eLearning in a large group format!
