



# The Tavistock Trust for Aphasia Distinguished Scholar

## How To Apply

The Tavistock Trust for Aphasia, in collaboration with Aphasia Access, will accept both **nominations** from a third party, or **applications** from individuals who wish to be considered for a Tavistock Distinguished Aphasia Scholar award.

**Either will need to provide:**

**A brief resume\***. The resume should be written to address the following sections as they apply to current experiences:

- contact information (phone, email address, etc.);
- relevant educational history;
- relevant service to the aphasia community;
- relevant presentations, publications and/or grants;
- relevant teaching and/or clinical experiences.

*\* The resume should not exceed 4 pages.*

**A brief essay** (of no more than 500 words) describing accomplishments in relevant areas below:

- Research and publications dedicated to improving life with aphasia;
- Working to improve external grant funding that addresses the needs of people living with aphasia;
- Mentoring of research students to conduct research associated with quality of life, life participation, conversation or similar topics related to life with aphasia.
- Training of future clinicians to address quality of life with aphasia.

### **Letters of recommendation**

**If you are nominating someone:**

- i. Please state your relationship to the person being nominated.
- ii. Please include 1 additional letter of recommendation:
  - This letter should explain why the person being nominated is a good candidate for The Tavistock Trust for Aphasia Distinguished Scholar award.

**If you are applying for yourself:**

- i. Please provide 2 separate letters of recommendation.
  - This letter should explain why the person being nominated is a good candidate for The Tavistock Trust for Aphasia Distinguished Scholar award.
